Rathkeale. Mr. Smith dispatched two Constables to
Foynes, and they returned on Sunday morning last, with
about £20 worth of goods that he had secreted there.—
The case was brought before James F. Massy, Esq. a
Magistrate, who took the necessary informations, and the
prisoner, Lillis, has been transmitted to Sandford Palmer,
Esq. to be disposed of as the law directs.

On Sunday night last, an armed party of men attacked
the dwelling house of Thomas Nunan, a farmer, on the
lands of Ballyphillip, near Croom, who, tho' they fired
some shots, spiritedly resisted and prevented their entrance.
Their object was to beat three men, natives of Kerry,
who were in his employment.

On Tuesday evening, between five and six o'clock, a
poor man, on his return from the market of Thurles was
waylaid a short distance from that town, and murdered in
the most inhuman manner. Messrs. Edmond Lanigan,
of Castlefogarty, and John Ryan, of Inch, having got
some account of the murderers, pursued them and succeeded
in apprehending one of the party.

James Byrne, Serjeant of the County Limerick Police,
was found drowned this morning, and his body taken up
at the New Bridge Works, supposed accidentally. An
Inquest is being held by the Mayor.

There was a meeting of the Roman Catholics of Ennis,
on Sunday, when a petition for Emancipation was adopted
and resolutions agreed to for collecting the Rent.—
Counsellor O'Gorman addressed the Meeting at great
length.

Doctor O'Shaughnessy, R. C. B. Killaloe, has had
printed and circulated 1000 copies of the correspondence
between Doctor Kelly of Tuam, and the Bishop of
Norwich.

The Rev. Mr. Meagher, on Sunday, occupied the chair
at a meeting of the Catholic parishioners of Holycross,
County Tipperary, to petition Parliament and collect the
Rent.

The Catholics of Middleton assembled on Sunday,
when 30l. were collected for the Rent.

The Recorder of Cork presided at a vestry meeting in
the parish of Kerrigcuppane, on Friday, when an offer of
250l. annually for the tithes was made to the Rector, Rev.
Mr. Hodder, but declined.

At a Special Vestry under the Tithe Composition Act,

The Tithe of Orchard Fruit, heretofore rigidly insisted

in the Consistorial Court.

Ordination on Sunday, the 19th of November. Candidates
are directed to be at Knocknagoney, his Lordship's resi-
dence, at ten o'clock on Thursday, the 16th.

The Duke of Montebello has not yet left Ireland.—
He was in Waterford last week.

The letter of Mr. Rice, M. P., and copy of the will of
the late Field-Marshal Count de Lacy of the Austrian
service, shall appear in our next. It is apparent from the
latter document, that the Irish relatives of this Officer
derive no benefit from his decease.

The Civil and Criminal business has not yet ended
