Mayor, having held an Inquest on the body of James Byrne, Serjeant of the County Police, from Ballybrowne, who was found drowned on Wednesday morning, at the Wellesley Bridge Work, the Jury returned a verdict "accidentally drowned." The unfortunate man has left a wife and six children unprovided for.

On Thursday night, a Rock notice was posted on the dwelling-house of one Mangan, in Askeaton, threatening him and family with severe punishment.

On Sunday night, in the town of Askeaton, a most dreadful riot took place—several of the rioters were severely injured, some of whom, on their return home, entered the house of a man named Fitzgerald, and beat him in the most inhuman manner.

Last night, an unoccupied house of John Hourigan, at Ballynanty, north liberties, was consumed by fire—he has stated upon oath maliciously.

Lieutenant Foster and a party of the 2d Revenue Police, were fired at near Enniskillen, on Monday night, when returning from duty. The fire was spiritedly returned and their assailants fled.

On Wednesday evening, a revenue boat with five men, was upset in a squall off Thompson's bank, near Belfast, all would have perished but for the Eclipse steam-packet, Captain Dalzell, coming in from Glasgow. The engines were instantly stopped, and the strugglers rescued from a watery grave.

Considerable damage was sustained in Newry, on Saturday, by the dwelling-house of Mr. T. M'Camley taking fire, and in the fury of the flames the tobacco-factory of M'Naghten and Dalzell was seriously injured. A detachment from the depot of the 77th Regiment was most useful in arresting the fire.

A young boy died of hydrophobia at Rathfryland, near Newry, on Monday, forty-nine days after he had been bitten by a pointer dog.

Thomas Wise, a publican, of Newry, his wife, and a soldier of the 73d Regiment, have been taken into custody for the robbery of Joseph Little, of Navan, from whom they forcibly took 40*l.* in bank notes.

The Thetis and Princess Royal transports, sailed from Cove, on Thursday, with the last division of the 86th Regiment, for the West Indies.
