 Possessing a strong and studious mind, his information  
 was general, and conveyed with a fluency and ease of  
 delivery, that distinguished the accomplished scholar from  
 the mere man of letters. We understand that Mr. Barry  
 has left unpublished some memorials of the profundity  
 of his genius, in the wide range of Mathematics, of  
 which he was a great admirer; these, we anxiously hope,  
 will not be lost to the public. The crowd of sorrowing  
 friends of the first respectability, who accompanied the  
 remains of this worthy citizen to his grave yesterday, was  
 an offering to merit and integrity that, with the belief that  
 his change has been to a better world, must be consolatory  
 to the feelings of his amiable but afflicted widow.
