 Quarter Sessions:—Patrick Collins and Michael Farrell,

 keep the peace; Patrick Quin, assault and larceny, six  
 months imprisonment and hard labor, and once publicly  
 whipt in front of the new County Court-House; John  
 Mulcahy and Michael Newman, riot and assault, to be  
 imprisoned three months and hard labour, and give  
 security to keep the peace; John Connell and James  
 Connell, like offence, three months imprisonment and  
 hard labor, and pay prosecutor one pound each, in default  
 to be imprisoned three months longer, and give security  
 to keep the peace; Michael Gleeson and John Gleeson,  
 assault, two months imprisonment and give security to  
 keep the peace; Edmond Dwyer and John Dwyer, riot  
 and assault, one months imprisonment each; James  
 Ryan, larceny, one months imprisonment and hard labor;  
 John Ryan, larceny, same sentence; Mary M'Namara,  
 assault, one week's imprisonment and hard labor, to pay  
 prosecutor five shillings, and in default to be imprisoned  
 one month longer.
