An arraed party of ten men attacked the dwellinger, houses of the following persons, between the hours of ur and seven o'clock on Tuesday evening last, at Glencolles. near Newport :- Patrick Kelly's house burned to the ground, and furniture, potatoes, plough, harrow, &c. totally destroyed; William Clifford's dwelling-house, furniture, and cow-house destroyed-they took from this house a blunderbuss; Pat Clifford's cow-house burned; Michael Clifford's cow-house and stable burned : James Kelly and William Halloran's house burned, with their entire furniture—they were princes, and have lost three cows and a horse, which were shot. Mr. Pearce, the Chief of Police, pursued the party for many miles, he could not come up with them. This dreadful outrage is attributed to a change in the tenantcy of the lands, the leases of the late occupiers having expired, and newcomers taking possession.

This morning Ulyses M'Eiligott, a fingly young lad, son of the late Mr. M'Elligott, of this City, classical teacher, fell out of a boat near Shannon-quay, and was drowned; the body was found a few hours after.

William Kenny, the labouring man who fell from & Munchin's Church, died in the Hospital, on Thursday, of the injury he received. He has lest a wife and for young children unprovided for.

On Thursday, a bull, the property of Mr. Hornibrock, of Rockfort. County Cork, gored the herdsman so dreadfully, that he died in a few hours.
