At two o'clock, this evening, the Chief Baron finished
the City Business, by receiving the Presentments, which
were all passed with the exception of that for the Jail
Inspector's salary. To this a traverse was entered (by
two landholders paying taxes, viz. John Ryan and Patrick
Bourke,) when Mr. O'Connell appeared for the traverse,
and Mr. Bennett for the Inspector, Mr. Gibson. The
Chief Baron called for the Act of Parliament which he
looked into for some time, and having stated that it was
clearly within the cognizance of the Bench to make such
order on the subject as should appear necessary from time
to time, said that he would leave the matter to be tried by
Judge Jebb, and fixed to-morrow for that purpose.

It is preposterous to think, while Dr. Sands, the Local
Inspector of the County Gaol, (than whom there cannot
be a more assiduous and correct officer,) receives £45 a
year for his services, which, in the County, are much more
extensive, from the number of prisoners, and the conse-
quent duty to be performed, that the City Gaol Inspector
should receive nearly four times that sum. This matter
has repeatedly been brought before the public, and as it
has now assumed a tangible shape, it is hoped it will get
that consideration from a Jury, which a harrassed and
oppressed population in the Liberties are reasonably
entitled to. The taxes in the Liberties amount to near
nine shillings an acre!!!

Assignees of Cottrell v. Bernard—Judge Jebb tried this
case, on Saturday. It was an action of trover to recover
value of goods, the property of G. C. Cotterell, a bank-
rupt, alleged to have been illegally seized and sold by
defendant, after the statute of bankruptcy was struck.
Verdict for plaintiff £568 Irish, and 6d. costs.

In the County Court before Judge Jebb, the following
capital convictions have taken place:—Patrick Browne,
for attacking the house of William Donoghue, near Castle-
town Conyers—death; Michael Kennelly for violating
the person of Eleanor Maher, at Old Town—death;
Michael Ryan and Michael White for assaulting the
habitation of Thomas Carr, at Knocknacarty—death.

There were no trials of importance in the County
Court, yesterday.

Saturday evening, after the conclusion of the public
business, the Chief Baron retired to his seat Rockbarton,
where he spent the following day and returned on Monday.

Sunday, Judge Jebb, in his robes, accompanied by the
Mayor, Sheriffs, and Corporation, in regalia, attended
divine service at the Cathedral.

The County Limerick Grand Jury have come to a
resolution to re-present as Insolencies, the balances due
since the year 1812, created by defaulting collectors.

Grand Juries. Alderman Thomas Carew is foreman of the
City, and Lord George Beresford is foreman of the
County.
