By his death the Right Hon. dir John Newport, Bart, becomes Father of the City, and Alderman Cornelius Bolton, who represented Waterford, with considerable distinction in the Irish Parlinment of 1783, besomes Charter Justice. Alderman Morgan died worth £250,000, which he has bequeathed to the Grogan family in the County Wexford.
