On Sunday morning last, between the hours of one and two o'clock, a fellow of the name of Jeremiah Hierlehy, with about twenty armed insurgents, attacked the Dwelling house of William Duane, a respectable farmer, living at Welsh's-town, near Church-town, in the County of Cork, broke in the door with a sledge, threw a quantity of fire in at the windows, beat William Dwane in a shocking manner, wounded his son with a pitchfork, fired several shots in the house, and took away the wido- Cowhie, Dwane's daughter, tearing a child about eight months old from her arms. Although every cearch has been made, they have not yet been discovered.

Ca Thursday morning, Martin Bulstrim, owner of a Galway sail boat, lying at the Long Dock, was found dead in the cabin. Same evening, the Mayor held an inquest on the body; the son and nepliew of deceased were examined, and proved having opened the hatch of the small cabin, in the morning, and found their relative suffocated. Another person admitted having gone with two others, the night before, into the cabin, where Bulstrim lay asleep, carried off a box of his, and then fastened down the hatch over his head. Mr. G. Ryan, Apothecary to the Dispensary, was examined; his belief was that the man died of suffocation; he examined his person, and observed no marks of violence thereon. Surgeon Thwaites was also examined, and confirmed the testimony of Mr. Ryan. On a full consideration of the circumstances, the Jury found a verdict that Martin Bulstrim expired of suffocation, Patrick Higgins and Edmond Rice having wilfully and maliciously closed the hatchment on him.

On Thursday night, four fat sheep, the property of Philip M'Adam, Esq. were killed on the lands of Spring Hill, County Clare. This is a repetition of a similar outrage committed on the property of Mr. M'Adam, and it is strongly suspected the authors of it have proceeded' from this City to the scene of violation.

A fine little girl was trampled to death by two horsemen at Bannow, near Waterford, on Sunday morning. The child was daughter of a Policeman, named Boyd.

A coal porter, named Condy, threw himself out of a window of the Fever Hospital of Wexford, on Monday night, in a moment of delirium, and was billed on the spot.
