three subalterns, and 160 men of the Plymouth division, embarked at Plymouth, on Tuesday, in the Bramble, Royalist, and Scorpion, and sailed for Portsmouth, to join the division stationed at that port.

The transports that took the 9th Regiment to Liverpool, have since sailed for Dublin, to bring the depots of the 1st and 2d battalions of the Rifle Brigade to Plymouth.

Monday, a Court Martial was assembled at Cork Barracks, to try a private of the 58th Regiment, of the name of Lynch, on a charge of giving false information in a case of murder. When the Regiment embarked lately for Portsmouth, Lynch was in Hospital, and with a view of being kept at home, sent for one of the Sheriffs to give information, relative to a murder, which he stated occurred about a year since, in or near Athy; which, on being closely investigated by the proper authorities, turned out to be a fabrication—he being, it would appear, at the time specified, in Kilmainham gaol, on a charge of theft.

Lieutenant Nowlan and a party of the 73d Regiment, rendered essential service at the fire in Mallow, on Friday, when Mr. Fitzgerald's mill and property were destroyed.

The late much lamented Thomas Westropp, of Ross-House, Co. Clare, has bequeathed Four Hundred Pounds to the Charitable Institutions of this City, as follows:—100L. to the Protestant Female Orphan School; 100L. to the Protestant Free School, and 200L. to the House of Industry, to be paid to Alderman Watson, and to be disposed of at his discretion.

At a meeting of the Governors of the House of Industry, held at the Exchange, this day, Richard Franklin, jun. Esq. was unanimously elected Surgeon to that Institution.

James Guerin, a watchman at the Wellesley Bridge works, fell into the dock, on Thursday night, and was so severely injured that he expired yesterday morning in the County Infirmary. The Mayor held an inquest yesterday, when a verdict of "accidental death" was returned.

On Sunday morning, a man, of the name of Michael O'Sullivan, entered a house of ill fame, in New Bridewell-lane, Cork, kept by one Mary Denny. A dispute ensued about a shilling, and in the affray he tore away a bed-post, with which he inflicted two desperate blows on the head of Mary Denny; a most extensive fracture was the immediate consequence, and the unfortunate woman expired on the spot. The murderer fled, but was pursued and apprehended; he is a pensioner, and had been serjeant and schoolmaster in the 21st Regiment. Same day an inquest was held on the body, and a verdict of wilful murder returned.

John Murphy, a cooper, died at a public house in Cork, on Sunday, from excessive drinking.

On Tuesday night last two houses, the property of Mr Watson, were maliciously burned in the neighbourhood of New Inn. Last May a defaulting tenant was dispossessed, this is the cause assigned for this atrocious violence.

On Tuesday night, two houses, consisting of a barn, cart-house, and stable, were maliciously consumed on the lands of Recchestown, near Ardfinan. Recchestown is the property of Robert Law, Esq. of Dublin.
