Yesterday, the Mayor held an inquest on the body of Michael Cusack, who fell off the shaft of his ear, at Thomond-Gate, was rolled over and so severely crushed, that he died on the spot. Verdict accordingly.

John Lysaght, a lunatic patient, aged 79 years, and a native of the County Clare, died in the New Asylum, on Monday. An inquest was held by the Mayor, and a verdict had—"Died by the visitation of God."

On Friday, an inquest was held by R. G. Green, Esq. Coroner, of Ennis, at Clare, on the bodies of two female children, who had been amusing themselves on the bank of the river with a small piece of board, which having slipped they both fell in and were unfortunately drowned.

Four sheep were killed on St. Thomas's Island, the residence of John Tuthill, Esq. on Saturday night last. The destruction of sheep in that part of the country is inconceivably great; but what renders it still more extraordinary is the mysterious and unaccountable manner in which it is effected. At one time it is reckoned the work of malicious incendiaries, and again it is attributed to some ferocious dogs. The carcasses of the sheep lay on the field, the heads mutilated and bloody.

Yesterday a small boy was bit in the face and arm by a bull-dog near the Mayor's stone.—The boy's features were terribly mangled by the ferocious brute.

On Saturday evening last, the wife of an industrious and comfortable farmer, named James Connelly, plundered her husband's dwelling, at Belvue, near Croom, in this County, of a considerable quantity of money and other property, and decamped with the noted *Bill Daly*, who assisted her in the robbery. On Monday evening, the circumstance was communicated to Mr. Vokes, who succeeded that night in apprehending Daly and the woman, with the greater part of the stolen goods. This woman was, previous to her recent acquaintance with Daly, considered a very proper character, and is the mother of seven children. Daly is a desperate fellow, charged with various offences, and the terror of the neighbourhood in which he resided.
