OF PROPRIETORS IN THE

Hibernian Joint Stock Company

AT a numerous and respectable Meeting of the Share-  
holders in the Hibernian Joint Stock Company,  
held this day, (Monday, November 5.) pursuant to  
Notice, at the Chamber of Commerce, THOMAS  
LYONS, Esq. in the Chair, the following Resolutions  
were unanimously adopted:—  
1st—That it appears to us that the terms of the Pros-  
pectus issued by the original Directors of this Company,  
upon the faith of which we became Proprietors, have not  
been fulfilled and that, consequently, our money deposited  
with them ought to be refunded.  
2nd—That Country Proprietors being by the Deed of  
the Company, as framed by the Direction of the Board  
of Management, excluded from voting by Proxy, they  
are unjustly deprived of all control over their own property  
and management of the Company.  
3rd—That it appears obvious to us, that the Company  
(if persevered in) must prove a positive loss to all the  
Proprietors (who are not Directors.) having no issue of  
Paper, being circumscribed to Dublin, discounting with  
capital merely and charging 5 per Cent, (while the Bank  
of Ireland and other Banking concerns discount at 4 per  
Cent.) thereby inviting to them an inferior class of Bills,  
without having any apparent source or front to meet the  
inevitable losses resulting from such a trade, added to  
the cost of a heavy Establishment.  
4th—That the Directors of this Company, receiving  
£1300 per annum amongst them, and having the patro-  
nage afforded by their situations as Directors, besides the  
facility of Discounting with our money for themselves,  
their friends and Connections, (without asserting that  
they exercise the powers improperly,) cannot be supposed  
to feel in common with us a desire to dissolve the Con-  
cern, but on the contrary must find it their peculiar advan-  
tage to continue it.  
5th—That a Forgery to the extent of £1400 and up-  
wards having been lately committed upon the Company,  
we apprehend they cannot as Bankers, prosecute for any  
Forgeries committed upon them, and that consequently  
our properties must be in extreme danger.  
6th—That a director has been appointed to the situation  
of Chief Emolument, (that of Secretary) in the Estab-  
lishment, thereby giving countenance to the imputation  
(which has been thrown out) that they make the Concern

7th—That a Committee of Five be now appointed,

a fund for carrying on the necessary proceedings to rescue

8th—That a circular address be published in the English  
and Irish Papers, inviting the Subscribers in both Coun-  
tries to co-operate with us.  
9th—That if deemed advisable, a petition to the Im-  
perial Parliament be forwarded, praying a Repeal of the  
Act under which the Company profess to be united.  
10th—That James Daly, Esq. be appointed Treasurer  
to the Fund to be raised as aforesaid, and that same, as it  
shall exceed £100, be lodged in the name of three Trust-  
ees for the Body in some approved of Bank.  
11th—That the Committee be empowered to appoint a  
Solicitor, and that our Chairman be requested to act as  
Secretary to the Committee.  
12th—That we pledge ourselves to follow up by every  
means in our power the attainment of these objects, and  
that these Resolutions be published in the English and  
Irish Newspapers, under the superintendence of the Com-  
mittee.
