The snow was so deep on the roads between this City and Dublin last Saturday, that the Mail did not arrive here before six in the evening. The mail coaches to Cork, Tralee, and Ennis, were delayed in consequence several hours after the usual time of despatch.

The Cork and Limerick mail coaches, on their way to Tralee, on Friday, were delayed considerably by the heavy snow of that day. The Limerick mail, due at seven in the evening, did not arrive until two o'clock on Saturday morning there.

The Mail-coach hence to Cork did not arrive in the latter city until five hours after the usual time on Wednesday last.

A Petition has been engrossed, and is now in course of signature, to the House of Commons, praying the House to take into consideration the state of the Navigation from Clare to Ennis.

Upwards of fifty Rockites and twelve Police had a desperate battle on Thursday night last, within two miles of Maryboro'. The Rockites attacked the house of Mr. Finegan, but were repulsed with the loss of one man, Courtesy, killed, two wounded, and four made prisoners. Fourteen hats and eight coats were left on the field of action.

Saturday night a fire broke out in the ground-floor of Messrs. Phelps' store near Shannon Quay, which spread rapidly to the timbers of the loft overhead, and but for the prompt aid given by the crews of the merchant vessels convenient the accident might have been attended with destruction to the whole concern. The damage sustained was inconsiderable. A candle falling on a quantity of bacon was the origin of the fire, and it was discovered in the first instance, by John Farrell, a Watchman of St. Michael's Parish, who instantly gave the alarm and burst in the gate.

On Friday, Charles Bennett, Esq. Coroner, held an inquest at Galbally in this County, on the body of James Slattery who was murdered a few days before. Slattery was privately buried to evade discovery, but the Magistrates had the grave re-opened and the body digested. — Surgeon Franklin, jun. examined the deceased, and a verdict of wilful murder was returned against persons as yet unknown. One man has since been arrested on strong suspicion of the crime.

Sunday, a soldier of the 28th Regiment, in a state of intoxication, died quite suddenly in this garrison.

A young man named Eugene Riordan died in Tralee a few days past in great agony, from swallowing a small particle of bone at dinner.

On Sunday last, a child of about two months old was found dead in the Demesne of Rock Grove, near New Glanmire, Cork. Its head was nearly beaten to pieces.

Simon Lynch, a farmer, from Ballyheige, perished in the snow near Adare, Kerry, on Friday night.

On Monday, a country-woman went to the Bank of Iceland Office, in this City, and tendered some Irish Bank Notes to change, but not knowing the amount, she was very properly taken before the Mayor, who retains the notes, in order that they may be restored to the owners. The notes amounted to a considerable sum.

A suspicious character is arrested in Cork, having in his possession a small double-faced gold stop watch cased, with green ribbon, key, and seal. It is supposed to have been stolen during the turmoil of our late County Elections.

A shoemaker's apprentice at Ennis was on Friday sentenced by the Magistrates to a fortnight's hard labour at the tread mill, for marrying without the consent of his master.

At Killarney Petty Sessions last week a man named McCarthy was sentenced to a month's imprisonment for assuring the County Sub-Sheriff in discharge of his duty.
