Sunday night being wet and cold, four sailors on board a schooner, lying at Lyons' Quay, provided some firing in the fore-castle, which they thought had been extinguished before going to hammock. Happily, however, their dangerous situation was ascertained in sufficient time to enable Doctor Geary, junr to employ friction and other stimulants, which ultimately rescued the poor fellows from their impending fate.

A youth, named James Cullane, died in this City, on Friday last, from the effects of taking a quantity of violent spirits. The stomach-pump was unsuccessfully resorted to. An inquest was afterwards held, and a verdict returned accordingly.

A young man named Stafford, formerly a Sergeant in the 84th Regiment, who it would appear has a penchant for New South Wales, was committed to gaol yesterday evening for breaking the window of a shop in Rutland-street, and taking thereout a piece of mercery.

The house of Mrs. Armstrong in Londonderry was burned down on Friday night, and two persons unfortunately perished in the flames, Mrs Brown, aged 64, and Ezekiel Beatty, aged 14.

The Post Office at KilmacThomas, County Waterford, was attacked on Wednesday night, and glass broken in the windows. A shot was fired from the Office which broke the leg of a female. Major Carter, Police Magistrate, is expected at KilmacThomas.

Mr. Boyle, of Cork, has made a curious application to the Mayor and Board of the Cork House of Industry, offering 20l. each from 200 individuals to raise the exhausted funds of that establishment, on condition of obtaining the freedom of the City. The proposal was un-
