He was the only surviving brother of Dr. Richard O'Connell, of Tralee, senior Magistrate of Kerry (who was one of the brave Naval Officers that was deputed to present the flag of truce to the noble sons of Washington), and father of the patriotic Mr. William John O'Connell. The shops in Kilmallock, Charleville, and the surrounding towns, were closed for two days, as a tribute of respect to the memory of the father of this young patriot.
