Michael Coy, sentenced to death at the county of
Galway assizes for the murder of his wife, underwent
yesterday the extreme penalty of the law in front of the
the prison. He spoke to the assembled multitude for a
few minutes in the Irish language, earnestly imploring
their prayers, acknowledging his guilt and the justice
of his sentence, and expressing his forgiveness of his pro-
secutors and of the world. The unfortunate man was
then launched into eternity and died after a few strug-
gles. His body underwent a *pro forma* dissection under
the hands of Dr. Vetch, of the County Infirmary.
