Doctor Egan, the Roman Catholic Bishop of Kerry, was visited at Killarney on Tuesday, by a deputation requesting the co-operation of himself and Clergy to collect the O'Connell tribute on Sunday. Doctor Egan told them "that he would not himself, nor would the Clergymen under his control give any facility, by the use of the Chapel to the proposed collection."

The situation of Secretary to the Wellesley Bridge Commissioners is vacant by the demise of Martin Arthur, Esq.

The Vicarage of Buttevant is vacant by the death of the Rev. Thomas Walker.

His Excellency the Marquis of Anglesey has appointed Doctor John Purcell, of Carrick-on-Suir, Surgeon extraordinary to the Irish Court.

Mr. Garrett Sheehy's and Mr. Sutherland's offices, at Mardyke, were attempted to be robbed on Wednesday night.

John Hynes, a porter, fell into the river at Shannon-quay, on Thursday night, and was drowned.

Monday night, an act of burglary and abduction was committed by some ruffians at Rinroe, near Corofin.

A burglary and robbery was perpetrated in a house within half a mile of Killarney on Friday, by six armed men. Twenty pounds were taken from one of the inmates.

On Monday, the Mayor of Drogheda seized twenty-two guns, sixteen pistols, and two blunderbusses, in the shop of an unlicensed gunsmith in that town.

There was a communication received by the Commanding Officer of the 7th Hussars, stationed in Dundalk, from the Executive, on Wednesday, requiring the troops to hold themselves in readiness to march to Drogheda, upon a moment's warning.

There was a meeting at Gort on Thursday, Mr. Blake Foster in the Chair, to Petition for the Repeal of the Union, and Parliamentary Reform.

Philip Daly, of Cloncah, County Galway, Esq. is to succeed Sir George Rich, as Master of the Ceremonies.

The pension on the Court List of £200 as set down for the Baroness Muskerry, is for the Widow of the late Lord Muskerry, who was a Major-General in the Army and for many years commanding officer of the 38th Regiment. The Dowager Baroness of Muskerry, not the present Lady Muskerry of Springfield, in this County, never received a farthing from the Government.

An office and high mass for the late Pope was celebrated in Peter and Paul's Chapel, Cork, on Wednesday, by Doctor Murphy, the Roman Catholic Bishop. The Chapel was hung in mourning.
