The demand for gold has entirely ceased on the Kilkenny Provincial Bank.

William Nugent MacNamara, Esq. M. P. left Dublin for London this week, to attend his Parliamentary duties.

At the Quarter Sessions of Tralee last week, Michael and John Cronin brothers were sentenced to six months imprisonments and a fine of £3 each, for a most atrocious assault upon Denis Sullivan.

At the Petit Sessions of Wexford on Wednesday, Daniel Cullen was prosecuted by the Revenue Board for having a quantity of wreck timber in his possession without paying duty, and refusing to surrender it. Penalty under the Act 6th Geo. 4th, ch. 108, £100, or three times the value of the timber, which last the Magistrates adjudged him to pay, viz. £27.

Rodolph M'Namara is committed to Clonmel Gaol, by Sir Hugh Gough, for three months, or to pay a fine of £5 for leaving the Constabulary, without a month's notice.

On Monday last a servant girl at Listowel, was dangerously wounded in the leg by a gun shot, fired by a servant man in the same house, who is since apprehended by the police.

It appears that the number of persons who lost their lives in affrays with the Constabulary in all Ireland, since the formation of that body in 1823, was Eighty-four, of which the following is the enumeration in each Province:—Ulster, 15; Leinster, 24; Connaught, 14; Munster, 31; Total, 84. Of the 31 set down for Munster, Six only were in Cork; Seven in Limerick; Sixteen in Tipperary, and two in Waterford. It is remarkable that in Kerry, during the entire period from 1823 to 1830, not a single casualty occurred either to the Police or People, in any affray.
