The Hon. Justice Webb, arrived in town last evening with his Lordship's Registrar, Rowley and, Esq., from Dublin, and will leave on Friday morning for Ennis.

The Grand Jury of the County Clare will be in before the Judges at Ennis next Monday, at o'clock in the afternoon, when Crown business immediately commences. There are 98 persons for trial, including nine for abduction, not one for murder.

Yesterday night an armed party attacked a farmer's house at Corofin, and robbed him of money and other property. They went to his son's house which was close by, and there they locked up all the inmates in a room, then a brave young man, named John Considine, through the roof, and called on a neighbour, James Hogan, for help, who, with his servant, James Hogan, turned out. They found the armed party coming to the second house they robbed, and they bravely sent one of them after a long contest, his name is Michael Vokes, from near Applevale. He got a severe beating in fight, but is not in danger from it; on his person and two threatening notices, the body written in ink, nature, "Terry Alt," written on each in blood—the notes are now in possession of Mr. Vokes. The prisoner is safe, and the witnesses are under the protection of the Magistrate.

This week a large field of wheat, the property of James Vokes, of Glenwilliam, Esq. a Magistrate of the County, was torn up, and the young produce scattered about. Yesterday night the boundaries of several farms on the estates of the Counties Clare and Galway, were maliciously cut to the ground. Several of the gentry are compelled to cut ground at a very low rent per acre.
