The man who was wounded and made prisoner at the attack on Mr. Walton's house near Sixmilebridge, had a flask of gunpowder and flints in his possession. In the encounter with the insurgents one of the Police had his coat perforated by four slugs.

At Waterford Assizes, William Neill was found guilty of forcibly violating the person of Honora O'Brien, at Cappoquin, and ordered for execution the 2d of April. In the case of Curren and Whelan v. Barrow, an action to recover the amount of £100 promissory note passed since 1814, the jury found £127 damages. Mary Gaffney, a fruit-woman, was tried for killing her husband, fined 6d. and discharged.
