

County Clare is truly indebted to Mathew Barrington, Crown Solicitor, for the unwearied industry, promptness and great professional skill, which this very active and gentleman has evinced in his important duties at Ennis Special Commission, where there was an unexampled accumulation of Criminal business. The several trials were produced for trial in a manner highly creditable to Barrington, and satisfactory to the County.

Mr. Moore and Jobb left Ennis at three o'clock on Monday, for Galway, where the Special Commission opened on Tuesday.

The Solicitor General conducts the prosecutions at the Special Commission in Galway and Roscommon, which are in his hands. The Attorney-General has returned to Dublin. Mr. Stagh Donnelly for the murder of Colour Sergeant Robinson, of the 5th Regiment, was executed yesterday at Ballinacally, County Clare, pursuant to sentence at the Special Commission. The culprit denied his guilt at the place of execution, and never did there attend so few spectators as an exhibition of this sort. None of the peasantry were to be observed near the fatal scene, and a group of men and children formed the only spectators, with the exception of the Military guard. On return to Ennis with the body, a prisoner was arrested on the road side, suspected of whiteboyism.

On Wednesday, thirty-two men were lodged in Ennis gaol, being convicted at Burren Petty Sessions and sentenced to two months imprisonment, for trespassing on Mr. Bindon's lands.

There are 20 prisoners yet in Ennis gaol untried, and charged with being directly concerned in the murder of Serjeant James Robinson, 5th Regiment.

There are three King's vessels in this river to prevent the malcontents in Clare from visiting the Counties of Limerick or Kerry—one at Ennis, one at Grass Island, and one at Tarbert, near Nimrod.

The following eight Stipendiary Police Magistrates are fixed in the county Clare—Major John O'Meara, Captain Dyas, Walter Weldon Molony, James Kins Brew, Major Brown, Capt. Warburton, John Vignoles, and Captain Colthurst—the depots are Miltown, Newmarket, Corofin, Killaloe, Burren, Ennis, and Tulla.

An encampment of troops is immediately to take place in the County Clare—tents are preparing for the 5th Regiment, to be posted in the County of Burren.

Yesterday several cars laden with camp equipage arrived in Dublin for the county Clare.

On this day an Officer's detachment of the 50th Regiment, from Templemore, arrive in Dublin, to return with arms and ammunition.

Yesterday the first division of the 10th Depot, under Captain Allen, arrived here from Tralee, and this morning left for Castlebar; the second division, under Major Freer, will follow on being ordered by the 32d Depot.

The Depot of the 66th left Castlebar yesterday, to occupy the late station of the 34th at Clare.

The depot of the 61st have moved from Ballinrobe to Enniskillen.

The Enniskillen Dragoons left Dublin on Wednesday, to take their quarters with the 8th Hussars, at Gort, Athlone, and Enniscorthy.

The entire of the 47th Regiment have arrived at Glasgow and Edinburgh.

The 91st being withdrawn from Jamaica the post of Major of Brigade is vacant, as Captain O'Meara is ordered to join his corps.

Captain O'Meara, and a draft from the depot of the 93d Highlanders, shortly leave Brecon for the West Indies.
