Grand total—houses, 4791; males, 19,870; females, 25,21ti, bota seves making an aggregate of 45,086—thus giving the fairer part of the creation a majority of 5,346 in the City of Limerick. According to this census compared with that of 1821,

the increase of population in John's Parish is 1,772, m Mary's Parish 207, in Nicholas Parish 2.006, in Michael's Parish 914, and in Munchin's Parish a decrease of 840-Total increase of population 4,059. The returns from 14 other parishes, including the suburbs and liberties of the City, are not yet completed.
