THE COMMISSIONERS appointed for administering the Funds placed at the disposal of his Excellency the Lord Lieutenaut, for the Education of the Poor of Ireland, are ready to receive Applications for aid towards the building and fitting-up of Schools, the paying of Teachers, and the obtaining of Books and School Requisites, on the follow-

1.-They will require that Local Funds be raised : 1s, For the Annual Repair of the School-House and Furniture. 2dly, Towards a permanent salary for the Teacher; the amount of such salary, in each case, to be settled with the approbation of the Commissioners. 3dly, For the purchase of Books and School Requisites, at half-price.

II .- Where aid is sought from the Commissioners for building a School-house, they will require that, at least, onethird of the estimated expense be locally contributed: that a site for building, to be approved of by the Commissioners, be secured for the purpose; and that the School-house, when finished, be vested in Trustees, to be also approved of by

III .- They will require that the Schools be kept open for a certain number of hours, on four or on five days of the week, at the discretion of the Commissioners, for Moral and Literary Education only; and that the remaining one or two days in the week he set apart, for giving, separately, such Religious Education to the Children, as may be appoved of by the Clergy of their respective persuasions. They will also permit and encourage the Clergy to give Religious Instruction, either before or after the ordinary School hours, on the other days of the week.

IV .- They will require to have the entire control over all Books to be used in the Schools, whether in the combined Moral and Literary, or separate Relig ons Instruction ;none to be employed in the former, except under the sauction of the Board, nor in the latter, but with the approbation of those Members of the Board who are of the same re-
