We perceive the new schooner "Garryowen," of London, arrived yesterday at our Quays, from Shoreham, where she was especially built for this trade. In a reference to a fatal case of supposed Cholera, which appears in the last English papers, and is copied under our London head, we are enabled to explain that no sickness appeared on board the vessel until 17 days after she had arrived in the Thames from this port—This must remove the suspicion of any contagious disorder having been imported by her from the Shannon, where the crews of all the vessels are uniformly healthy. The name of the merchant vessel alluded to is the Felicity.
