County of Limerick, ITTHE General Quarter Sessions will be held at Rathkeale, on Monday, the 26th of March, at Jen o Clock in the Morning, for the Division of Rathkeale, and the Civil Business will be proceeded with in the following order :- First, the Processes from the Barony of Kenry ; next, those from that part of Coshma which lies to the west of the Maigue; next, those from the Barony of Lower Connelloe; and lastly, those from the Barony of Upper Connelloe. On Friday, the 30th, Ejectments will be heard in the Morning; and on the same day at twelve o'Clock the Grand Jury will be sworn, -after which the Appeals will be heard, and then the Freeholders registered; and lastly, the Crown Business disposed of.

The attention of Suitors from Upper and Lower Connelloe is particularly drawn to the change in the order in which

the Baronies are placed.
