Surgeon.-Seldom has it fallen to our lot to record the death of a more respected citizen. Mr. Franklin commenced his professional career in the Naval Service of his Country-having served as an Assistant-Surgeon on board the Valiant, 74, on the 12th of April 1782, which Ship bore so distinguished and gallant a part in the celebrated Naval action and victory gained by our fleet (under the command of Admiral Lord Rodney,) over the enemies of Britain. After having served Ten Years in the Royal Navy, Mr. F. returned to his native land, but being of an active and enterprizing disposition, he shortly re-entered the service of his King and Country, and on the formation of the 2d Fencible Light Dragoons, was appointed Surgeon thereto, and continued so until the reduction of the Regiment in 1799. He then returned to his native City and has since practised extensively as an eminent Surgeon, and attended on most of our public charities. By his death, society has lost a kind hearted, honorable, and useful member, and the Medical Profession will long regret the loss of one of its oldest and most esteemed practitioners.
