And of that people am I about to take what must be called a political farewell. To that people am I about to declare, that honoured as I feel by the high trust which they have twice reposed in my hands, proud and flattered as I should feel again to appear as their Representative,—still I am compelled to deny myself the gratification of appearing before them as a candidate for their suffrages.—And that I now resign into their hands the charge with which they entrusted me, conscious that if I have not in all things discharged it efficiently, I have at least done so honestly and zealously for what I conceived their best interests.

Men of Clare, it is my wish, and I am sure you will allow that it is but a natural one, on resigning the representation of your County, to have your testimony to the fact, that no dereliction of principle, no act contrary to your interests, on my part; or again, that no change of political opinion—no suspicion of your representative on your's, could have led to this separation. For myself, I call fearlessly for your testimony; as relates to you I repose an humble, but a steady trust on your avowed sentiments, and your acknowledged opinions.

I have been called upon to come forward as a candidate for the representation of the Borough of Tralee—of the capital of my native county, and the spot which I may almost call my birth-place. A portion of the inhabitants of that town are willing to honor me by naming me as their representative—on the first Election in which then the franchise will be exercised, in their instance, by the people—and to their wishes have I for many reasons gladly acceded.

Men of Clare, the name which I inherit has been connected with yours on more than one great political occasion,—and, thank God, on more than one great Political Triumph. I will not recall to your recollection the fate of those who at Aughrim and at Limerick sealed their devotion to their Country with their blood,—but with mingled pride and gratitude, I refer to the glorious and bloodless triumph of 1828,—to the continuation of that triumph in 1829,—and I cannot but remember that since you deigned to accept of my services, humble as they are, they have been lent to the carrying that great measure which has laid the foundation of a perfectly constitutional Representation of the People of these Realms.

Men of Clare, our names have been written together on the page of history; I now make way for another—may he serve you more effectually than him whom he replaces. One thing I am sure of, that his honest zeal in your cause, and his intention to discharge his duty faithfully, cannot be greater, as I am equally certain that you must be always gratefully remembered by, and your interests through life dearer than his own to
