There was a good fair at Six-mile-Bridge on Wednesday, several lots of fat cattle were sold. The buyers were all from the County of Cork.

Philip Harty, of Nenagh, died of Cholera, on Thursday, where several other fatal cases have also occurred. Mrs. Savage, wife of Mr. Savage, gauger, died of Cholera yesterday.

It is not true that a party of Lieutenant Fennell's police, accompanied by Mr. Cooper, Revenue Officer, were lost on the coast of Cunnemara, during the storm that prevailed on Friday night.

Several vessels have been cast ashore on the Cunnemara coast since the recent heavy gales. One of them is a derelict, of 100 tons burthen, and supposed to be a transport. The friends of Mr. Lambert, in the county Galway, give their support at the ensuing election, to Mr. Martin, of Balbriggan.

During the violent thunder storm with which Loughrea was visited on Sunday morning, we regret to learn that the spire of the new and handsome church was completely destroyed about the hour of 10 o'clock, a.m. The lightning struck upon the spire, which it instantly destroyed, and fell upon the roof of the edifice reduced the entire structure to the ground.
