At a general meeting of the Governors of Barrington's Hospital and City Infirmary, held on Monday last, the following were elected a committee of management for the ensuing year:—Dr. Ryan, R. C. B. William Roche, M. P. Alderman D. F. G. Mahony, Thomas P. Vokes, C.M.P. John Kelly, John H. M'Knight, Joseph M. Harvey, A. J. Watson, William Howley, Francis P. Russell, Pierce Shannon, Philip M'Ardeil, and Richard Franklin, Esqrs.

The report of Mr. Jackson, manager of the District Lunatic Asylum, for the year ending 1832, to the Governors of that Institution, exhibits the following interesting particulars: Inmates under treatment during the year, 141 males, 126 females; total, 267. Cured and discharged in the above period, 33 males, 31 females; total 64. In the Asylum the 1st of January, present year, 93 males, 84 females; total 177. Of this number 20 males and 14 females were from the City of Limerick—26 males and 27 females from the County Limerick—33 males and 25 females from the County Clare—14 males and 18 females from the County Kerry. There are now in the house 79 patients of both sexes considered incurable, 28 convalescent, and 70 cases considered curable. It is a very laudable characteristic of this Institution that the Inmates, by their own labour in the garden, produced 140 brls of potatoes in the last year, besides roots and vegetables. The admissions for the year were more numerous than any preceding, yet the discharges exceeded any former number. Employment appears to have made a most favourable change in the intellect of the patients generally, and the system of interior economy observed in the establishment has been productive of the best effects.
