Of this number 20 males and 14 females were from the City of Limerick-26 males and 27 females from the County Limerick-33 males and 25 females from the County Clare-14 males and 18 females from the County There are now in the house 79 patients of both sexes considered incurable, 28 convalescent, and 70 cases considered curable. It is a very thudable characteristic of this Institution that the Inmates, by their own labour in the garden, produced I40 bris of potatoes in the last year, besides roots and vegeta')les. The admissions for the year were more numerous than ny preceding, yet the discharges exceeded any former number. Employment appears to have made a most favourable change in the intellect of the patients
