FATAL DUEL.—On Saturday morning, at six o'clock, a hostile meeting took place between John Power White, Esq. (late a medical student, and son of Power White, Esq. of Golden, county Tipperary,) and Mr. Weldon, of Molesworth street, in Sallypark, near Parnell-bridge, Grand Canal. The former was attended by the Hon. Edward Butler (son of Lord Dunboyne) as his second, and the latter by Mr. Bodkin, of Galway. The seconds measured twelve long paces, east and west—and the parties fired by signal. Mr. White received his adversary's ball over the right eye; it passed out at the back of the head, killing him on the spot. The seconds immediately absconded; and the body was brought by the lookers-on, from the midst of the field where the fatal shot was fired, to the inside of the wall which separates it from the road, on the north side of the canal, leading from Portobello to the first lock; here it lay till half-past one o'clock, where the coroners, Messrs. Pasley and M,Carthy, swore a jury, and proceeded to the examination of the body. From what was elicited at the inquest, it appeared that the challenge had been sent by Mr. Weldon in consequence of some harsh language used to him by Mr. White, in the Shades, College-green, on Thursday night. We understand that the primary cause of dispute originated in an affair of honour between two friends of the principals in this quarrel. Messrs. White and Weldon succeeded in arranging that affair amicably, but a misunderstanding took place between themselves, which gradually increased till it broke out in an open quarrel on Thursday night. It appeared also that Mr. White had been second to his friend the Hon. E. Butler in an affair between that gentleman and Captain O'Doherty, some time since. Mr. Weldon originally bore the name of Rowley, but changed it for Weldon, on the acquirement of some property lately. He is said to be of a very eccentric character. The following is the substance of the evidence as yet elicited:—Mr. George Fittin was examined, and after much hesitation, and being pressed by the Coroner and Jury, stated that Mr George Gloster, an attorney, told him that he was present and had done—and he (witness) believed him—everything in his power, as far as he could interfere, not being a principal or second, to adjust the affair amicably. Mr. Gloster also told him that the duel was as fair and as honorable a one as anything of the kind could possibly be. The Coroner adjourned the further investigation to Tuesday. The deceased was a young gentleman remarkable for a very handsome face and figure, and was much liked by those acquainted with him.
