The Court of King's Bench has pronounced its opinion in the case of *Marcus Costelloe, v. Trinity College*. The Chief Justice said, that the case was one of too much consequence to be disposed of by mere motion, and they now granted the mandamus, to give an opportunity of trying the question in full, on its merits, and on the return of the writ.

The remains of the Hon. Mr. Clifford, who was in his 27th year, and died suddenly in this city, as stated in our last, were removed to St. John's Chapel, from whence the funeral cavalcade left at twelve o'clock on Wednesday, followed by all the troops in garrison, and surrounded by an immense number of spectators. Prayers were read in the Latin service in the church-yard, by the Clergy present; after which the soldiers of his own company fired three rounds over his body, when the troops marched home in quick time.

The following was the order of the Procession, which had a most imposing effect:—3 Dragoons in front, mounted—Firing Party, 50 rank and file—2 Dragoons, mounted—Band of 83d Regiment—Muffled Drums, 83d Regiment—Dean M'Namara, and 20 R. C. Clergy, 2 and 2, in white scarfs—THE BODY—borne on a gun-carriage, by 4 horses of the Royal Artillery—6 bearers, Officers of the 83d regiment—Physicians and Surgeons of Regiments—Gentlemen Civilians, two and two—83d Regiment, in sections—32d Reserve, in sections—Royal Artillery—Dragon Guards, dismounted—Officers of Corps—General and Staff.

The Court of King's Bench, in the case of *Kenny v. Delmage*, has discharged the conditional order for a criminal information against the defendant.

After the ceremony, the new Bishop gave a splendid *dejeune* to the Bishop, Clergy and Laity, who attended the ceremony. A hundred gentlemen afterwards sat down to an excellent dinner.
