been despatched for a detachment of cavalry, the escort soon
came up, and the six prisoners were conveyed to the Bride-
well, followed by an immense crowd, shouting, screaming,
and hallooing as the cavalcade passed along.

Saturday evening, a dreadful riot occurred in Killarney,
commencing in the neighbourhood of the Court-House,
while the Quarter Sessions were holding, and soon extend-
ing to the Main-street. It was eventually suppressed by the
active exertions of John Morphy, Esq. a Magistrate, aided
by Captain Varlo and his company of the 76th Regiment.
No lives were lost on the occasion.

The Loughrea Quarter Sessions terminated on Tuesday ;
there was not as much done in the civil bill business as usual
in consequence of the disappearance of a process-server, who
had nearly 300 civil bills to serve, and who has not been
heard of since the 6th of June, on which day it was as-
certained he left Loughrea for the neighbourhood of
Tynagh and Woodford, to serve Processes and other law
papers. The Police, for several days, made diligent search
for him, but all to no effect. It is supposed that the unfor-
tunate man must have been murdered, and a person against
whom he had a decree is strongly suspected.

William Conway was admitted to the County Infirmary on
Thursday, suffering under fracture of the head, caused by
the blow of a stone, on Sunday last.

Mary Hayes, a fine child, between five and six years old,
died in the County Infirmary yesterday morning, a few hours
after admission. Her family left her alone the night before
in a small apartment, at Garryowen, where there was a
quantity of dry rushes for chair-making. By some accident
the materials ignited, and the flames soon communicated
with the little girl, who was so dreadfully burned, as to
survive only a short time after.

A fine young fellow, a pilot from Kilbaha, striving to
board a vessel in this river last Monday, was upset in his
canoe and drowned.

The constituency of Waterford received an addition of
forty-seven last week, at the County Quarter Sessions. One
hundred and thirty-seven notices had been served ; fifty-three
of these appeared, and of those six were rejected. The num-
ber registered for the County was extremely few.

On Wednesday morning two men were caught in the act
of robbing the King's store at Galway, of tobacco.
