and hallooing as the cavalcade passed along.

It was eventually suppressed by the active exertions of John Morphy, Esq. a Magistrate, aided by Captain Varlo and his company of the 76th Regiment. No lives were lost on the occasion.

The Loughrea Quarter Sessions terminated on Tuesday; there was not as much done in the civil bill business as usual in consequence of the disappearance of a process-server, who had nearly 300 civil bills to serve, and who has not been heard of since the 6th of June, on which day it was ascertained he left Loughren for the neighbourhood of Tynagh and Woodford, to serve Processes and other law papers. The Police, for several days, made diligent search for him, but all to no effect. It is supposed that the unfortunate man must have been murdered, and a person against whom he had a decree is strongly suspected.

Mary Hayes, a fine child, between five and six years old, died in the County Infirmary yesterday morning, a few hours after admission.
