John Ryan, who we mentioned to have been apprehended for the murder of Honoral Teahan, on Saturday last, was tried and convicted of this barbarous crime, and sentenced to be executed on this day, exactly within one week after perpetrating this unprovoked and diabolical crime. No other case of interest occurred.

Mr. Justice Vandeleur took his seat in the Record Court, and proceeded to try Appeals from the Quarter Sessions and Manor Courts, which were soon disposed of.

Wednesday evening, Francis, a fine boy, son of Mr. Robert Wheeler, of Catherine-street, was drowned while bathing at Meade's Quay, in view of several other boys.

In the record of convictions at Galway Assizes, which appeared in our last, are the names of Darby Goode, and Patrick Quailter, for appearing in arms last Easter Tuesday, stopping the carriage of the Venerable Archdeacon Butson, near his own residence, and serving a Terry Alt notice on that Rev. gentleman, through the carriage window. They were sentenced to fourteen years' transportation.

The Donegal grand jury have applied to the Lord Lieutenant for a stipendiary magistrate for the central part of Enniskillen.

The Magistrates at Ennistimon Petty Sessions have sentenced several rioters at the last fair of that village to pecuniary penalties or a month's imprisonment, for damage done to various kitchen-gardens in a furious battle between two factions, the Carthys and Davrens, who indulged their brutal passion for fighting in the absence of the Police at Ennis Assizes.

John Brinkwater, private of the 32d Regiment, has been sentenced by Court Martial, to four months imprisonment and hard labour in the County Gaol.

Two brothers, John and Patrick Lyons, coopers, from this City, were sentenced in Waterford to two months imprisonment and hard labour, for stealing two decanters of whiskey. They were starving, and committed the robbery they said with a view of getting transported.

A soldier of the 37th regiment narrowly escaped being drowned on Sunday evening, at the rere of the Castle Barrack. He had sunk for the last time, when a spirited fellow, named Byrne, dived after him with his clothes on, and found the soldier at the bottom grappling with the mud. He immediately brought him up, when a boat from the Thomond Gate side came to the relief of both.

A soldier belonging to the 80th regiment on march through Kingscourt, shot himself on Wednesday morning. A coroner's inquest returned a verdict of temporary insanity.

Two deserters from the 99th Reserve Companies at Boyle, have been arrested in Tulla, county Clare, and will be sent to head-quarters.

Mr. Nicholas Purcell O'Gorman is gone to Bandon, to preside at an investigation, respecting the conduct of Captain Vignolles, Stipendiary Magistrate, Mr. Feargus O'Connor, M.P. shortly before his departure from London, preferred a complaint against Captain Vignolles, for conduct at Bandon, on the first of July. It was alleged by Mr. O'C. that Capt. Vignolles had sanctioned the proceedings of the Orangemen. The investigation is for the purpose of ascer-
