On Monday fifteen convicts under rule of transportation arrived here from Ennis under an Infantry escort, and were forwarded yesterday morning to the hulk Surprise in company with seven convicts from our County Gaol, whose names we annex:—Patrick Roche, for life; John Kennedy, Charles Hayes, Maurice Fitzgerald, Laurence Ahern, Deuis Ahern, and Charles Bourke, for seven years.

On Monday morning, Ellen Horrigan, a young woman, residing in Bow-lane, was most dreadfully burnt in consequence of her bed of straw having taken fire. She was immediately admitted into Barrington's City Hospital, in nearly a hopeless state. She admits having drank freely of spirituous liquors during the previous day. The unfortunate woman lingered in excruciating torture until yesterday evening, when death closed her mortal sufferings. This shocking occurrence took place in one of those low receptacles of infamy and vice, Newgate-lane, in St. Mary's Parish, where the profligate of both sexes are encouraged in excesses which are revolting to humanity and religion. The attention of the Clergy and Parish Authorities would be well directed to those nurseries of crime.

On Wednesday evening, as two men were returning from Castle-Connell Regatta, they were met by several others at Annacotty, who enquired the particulars of the boat race, and immediately after attacked the two men with stones, one of whom received four desperate wounds in the head, and the other had his fingers nearly severed by a reaping hook.

On the same evening, a man named John M'Namara, was also returning from the boat race, and went into a house at Annacotty, for a drink of water; on coming out he saw two men wheeling and bawling out "here is another of them," upon which one of them came up to M'Namara, and struck him a blow on the head which fractured his skull. M'Namara was deprived of his senses for several minutes, and was conveyed to Barrington's Hospital next morning. He believes the weapon with which he was struck to be an iron bar.

Monday evening a little boy was knocked down by a horse and car in Thomond gate, and the wheel of the vehicle passing over his leg, fractured the limb above the knee. He is under treatment in Barrington's hospital.

A man of the name of William Connell was drowned on Tuesday night, while returning to Oysterhaven from the Kinsale Regatta. He and his father were in the same boat: both were intoxicated.

On Thursday last, a carman named Dennis Connellan, conducting the baggage of the 15th Hussars, on route to Cork, stumbled, by coming in contact with a stone, and fell on the road—a four wheeled baggage cart passed over him and dreadfully fractured his arms, one in two, and the other in three parts.

An inquest was held near Dingle, on Thursday, by James M'Gillycuddy, Esq. Coroner, on the body of Maurice M'Donnell, who was waylaid and cruelly beaten about a month since. The jury brought in a verdict of wilful murder against three persons who are well known, but have as yet evaded justice.
