

Patrick Bourke, severely assaulting John Coffy;—By Bolton Waller and Thomas Davenport, Esqrs. Massy and James H. Massy Dawson, Esqrs. Timothy Egan, assault on Lawrence Hogan, to pay £2 2s. or be imprisoned with hard labour for one month;—By John Wilcocks, Esq. John Fogarty, Patrick Walsh, John Walsh, Robin Walsh, Patrick Casey, and John Halloran, being of an armed party who assembled on the lands of Garryduff, and forcibly dug and feloniously carried away a quantity of potatoes, the property of John Coffy, and having fired shots at the Police and at said Coffy.

A decent young man, named William Clarke, was way-laid and brutally murdered by five or six men, at Drom-sallee, in this County, last Thursday evening, near his own house. This fatal outrage resulted from an old party spleen. An Inquest was held by Mr. Bennett on Friday, and a verdict of wilful murder returned against the perpetrators.

The two violent factions the Hayes, and Connors, who rushed with arms into the late fair of Hospital, and dispersed the buyers, re-assembled on Friday in still greater force at the fair of Cappamore, whither a troop of the 4th Dragoon Guards from this garrison went by express early same morning, and remained to assist the Civil power.—The presence of the military prevented a conflict, but a number of shots were fired, and the military immediately recharged the rioters, who fled in all directions. One man of the name of Morrissy, exulting at the imaginary triumph of his party, snapped a blunderbuss which exploded in his hand, and he was brought into Hospital on Friday evening, where he suffered amputation of the wounded member.—Another fellow named Coffee running out of the fair with a cocked pistol which he wished to conceal from the authorities, thrust it into his pocket, where the charge instantly went off, and dangerously lacerated his arm. Those are the only casualties which occurred.

The Visitation of the Archbishop of Cashel, as Diocesan of Waterford and Lismore, was held at the Cathedral Church of Lismore on Wednesday, by the Rev. R. Hobson, Vicar-General of the Diocese, when an excellent and appropriate sermon was delivered by the Rev Archdeacon Power. The attendance of the Clergy was unusually numerous. The Archbishop was not present.

The tithe commissioners in the county Kilkenny are meeting with considerable opposition. Outrages are as frequent as ever they had been in that county, notwithstanding the coercion bill.

Lieut. Losh, 23d Fusileers, under trial by Court Martial at Clonmel, will enter on his defence next Thursday, to which day the proceedings are adjourned.
