Monday night we were visited by a tremendous sample of the equinoctial gales, not unusual at this season. It blew most furiously from the west-north-west in appalling squalls or gusts of wind until daylight next morning, when the weather moderated. We are happy to say the shipping in port rode out the gale in safety, and the damage was in chief confined to a partial stripping of house roofs. Violent showers of hail accompanied the storm.

The General Quarter Sessions for the City and Liberties commence on the first day of the new year.

A man of the name of Welsh, working in the Thomond-gate Distillery, fell from a high loft in that establishment, on Saturday night, and was so badly injured, that he died in a very few hours after. The fatality was purely accidental.

A newly born infant, deserted by its inhuman parent, was found on Thursday night at a hall door in Catherine-street.

Saturday night last, Constable John Hourigan and Sub-Constable Warren, of the Peace Preservation Police, and Sub-Constables M'Connell and Shanahan, of the Constabulary, succeeded in arresting William Bresning, under a warrant of the Rev. Mr. Coote, for cow stealing. They also took up a pistol and powder cannister with some powder, when prisoner was arrested. He has been fully identified and committed to gaol by Thomas P. Vokes, Esq.

On Monday a stable containing two cows and a sheep, the property of Thomas Hinchey, a farmer, residing on the road leading from Dundalk to Soldier's-Point, was maliciously set on fire and entirely burned down.

The Lord Lieutenant has offered 100*l.* reward for the murderers of Miles Harte, near Ballina, county Mayo.

Charles G. Fairfield, Esq. High Sheriff and Deputy Lieutenant of Kerry, held the investigation ordered by Government in Dingle, of all the circumstances connected with the opposition to rents in the Parish of Donurlin; and the rescue of the cattle was clearly proved and the right of the person who ordered the distraint acknowledged. The fact of combination to resist payment of rent, was not so clearly established. Informations were ordered against the persons who were concerned in the assaults and rescue.
