TO THE PUBLIC. TR. WILLIAM FREWEN, of the ROYAL SHADES HOTEL, having seen an advertisement in the Limerick Chronicle of last Saturday, in which he is declared not to be the heir at law of Thomas Frewen, M.D., takes leave to lay before the Public the following statement of

That Mr. William Frewen has abundant proof to convince those interested that he alone is the "heir at law" of his unfortunate parent; and that the deed alluded to in the advertisement, in which he is declared to be such, was drawn up by the late JOHN FITZGBRALD, Esq. Attorney-at-Law, and witnessed by Messrs. O'GRADY and FITZGERALD. junior-duly and deliberately signed by his father. Doctor FREWEN, thro', as it declares, "bis natural love and affection for him"-that it is registered in Dublin, and that no legal form was wanting whereby it should be rendered perfect.

That the "peculiar circumstances" spoken of, are these -a revival of the natural affection of a parent on the sight of a long absent son-a wish to reinstate him in those rights, at the deprival of which his weakness had long connived, and a determination, as he himself styled it, " that the Brats of his brother should not inherit the portion of his children."
