County Limerick Infirmary. PREPARATORY MEDICAL AND SURGICAL SCHOOL.

Extract from the Regulations respecting the Qualification
of Candidates for Letters Testimonial of the
Royal College of Surgeons in Dublin.

"Every Apprentice to a Member of the College, is re-
quired to produce such Certificates of Attendance on the
practice of an Hospital or County Infirmary, as may
satisfy the Court of Examiners that he has enjoyed
sufficient opportunity of acquiring professional informa-
tion: and every Pupil who has not served an appren-
ticeship is required to produce Certificates of attendance
on the practice of a Surgical Hospital or County Infir-
mary, containing, at least, fifty Patients, for three years, or
five winter Sessoids."

As by the foregoing regulations, large Provincial Hospitals
Preparatory Medical Schools, the Physicians and Surgeons
of the Limerick County Infirmary, have made the following
arrangements by which young Gentlemen about to enter the
Medical Profession, may have opportunities of improving
themselves in all its departments.
