SCHOOL.

PARATORY MEDICAL AND SURGICAL

" Every Apprentice to a Member of the College, is re-" quired to produce such Certificates of Attendance on the " practice of an Hospital or County Infirmary, as may " satisfy the Court of Examiners that he has enjoyed " sufficient opportunity of acquiring professional informa-" tion: and every Pupil who has not served an appren-" ticeship is required to produce Certificates of attendance on the practice of a Surgical Hospital or County Infir-" mary, containing, at least, fifty Patients, for three years, or " five winter Sessoins."
