The number of applications for Presentments on the County  
this Assizes is 314, including 32 in Upper Connelloe,  
Glenquin 31, Lower Connelloe 11, Shanid 21, Costlea 24,  
Coshma 17, Small County 12, Clanwilliam 18, Coonagh 21,  
Kenry 7, Pubble Brien 9, Owneybeg 7, and Liberties of  
Kilmallock 2. The total amount applied for is 15,590l.—  
More than three-fourths of those applications have been ap-  
proved at Road Sessions by the Magistrates.

The parish of Kilpeacon, near this City, was recently the  
scene of midnight outrage, an armed party having forcibly  
entered two farm houses, sworn one of the inmates, and fired  
shots on their departure.

Saturday evening last, the house of an agricultural  
cottier, at Ballykett, near Kilrush, named Neill, was at-  
tacked by three men, who struck and beat the owner, a  
young man, in so merciless a fashion, as to produce death in  
a few minutes. The offenders are recognised and in custody.

William O'Brien, a grown lad of 14 or 15 years, died on  
Monday in Forker's lane, Irishtown, of bodily injuries sup-  
posed to, be inflicted by Joseph M'Namara, a labourer, on  
Saturday night last. The Mayor held an inquest on the  
deceased, but no satisfactory evidence of the cause of the  
fatal issue was adduced.

The Lord Lieutenant has offered £100 reward for the  
incendiaries who burned the premises of Thomas Parkinson at  
Heathstown, Queen's County, and wounded himself and son.

A farm house, situate on the lands of Kinneagh, Carlow,  
the property of the Rev. John Spray, was maliciously set fire  
to by some lawless miscreants, and burned to the ground.

Thursday night last an attack was made on the house of  
Mrs. Daunt, Hettyville, near Kiasale, by a party of from  
15 to 10 fellows, who broke in the door, entered, and  
searched the house, and carried off a valuable gun worth  
twenty guineas.

Richard Butler, Esq. of Keylong, Caher, an aged gen-  
tleman, fell down a flight of stone steps on Monday, and  
coming on his head; died a few hours after.
