In Charleville, the Rev. William Dunne, Rector of that Parish.  
 Sir Henry Brooke, Bart. of Colebrooke, Fermanagh, who was  
 attacked by apoplexy on Tuesday, and almost immediately expired,  
 in the 64th year of his age. In all the duties of private and public life,  
 Sir Henry acquitted himself with integrity and honor. His title and ex-  
 tensive estates descend to his eldest son, now Sir Arthur Brooke, Bart.  
 At Cheltenham, after a long and painful illness, which he bore with  
 the fortitude and resignation of a Christian, the very Rev. Sir Geo.  
 Bisshopp, Bart. Dean of Lismore, and Archdeacon of Aghadoe. He  
 was the only son of Edward Bisshopp, Esq. (third son of Sir Cecil  
 Bisshopp, Bart. of Parham), by Jane, only daughter of Wm. Atkinson,  
 Esq. of Pall-Mall. By Lady Bisshopp, who died in 1832, he has left  
 five children, the eldest of whom, Cecil Augustus, succeeds his  
 father in the title.
