MELANCHOLY ACCIDENT.—About half-past three o'clock on Monday, a very fine boy, aged twelve years, son of Mr. Ryan, Grocer, Broad-street, went to bathe at the back of Hogan's Mill, on the Canal, but melancholy to state he sunk, and the body remained under water nearly half an hour, when it was taken up and immediately brought to the City Infirmary. Surgeons Franklin and Kane were immediately in attendance, and used every effort to restore the poor lad to life, but after two hours unceasing exertions they were obliged to relinquish every hope of doing so. The state of the young lad's parents is most lamentable, having but a very short time before the accident given him leave to play after coming from school.—The Infirmary is supplied with a complete set of apparatus for restoring suspended animation.

The Mayor, on Monday last, held an inquisition upon the body of Michael Regan, at the County Infirmary, where he died the Saturday evening previous, of a fracture in the head, caused by the blow of a stone, inflicted at Murroe in this county, by a man of the name of Simon Humphrys.—A verdict to the above effect was returned. The deceased was a young man.
