

Monday morning the Mail-car travelling from Waterford to this City was suddenly stopped near the wood of Bansha, county Tipperary, on the high road, by six armed ruffians, who deprived the driver and guard of a case of pistols, after which they suffered the vehicle to resume its route, without disturbing the mail bags,

On Saturday night, three men well armed, attacked the house of James Adamson, a farmer, residing near Court Bridge, in this county. They fired two shots into the window which were quickly returned by Adamson, who by his bravery was enabled to drive off those fellows and preserve his arms, to obtain which, it appears was their sole object.—The Chief Magistrate of police has offered a reward of £10 for such information as will lead to the conviction of this band.

Monday last the Mayor held an inquest at the county infirmary, upon the body of James Raleigh, a young man who died there the day before of a fracture on the head from the blow of a stone near a month previous in John's square. The perpetrator, name unknown, has absconded. A verdict to the above effect was returned.

Serjeant Moore, of the City Police, has apprehended in town, a suspicious character, who gave his name Timothy Hogan, on whose person this active officer found the following brief political catechism in manuscript, running in the usual outre style of such matters—"Good morrow brave fellow. Good morrow Sir. How far will you steer—As far as my General. Who is your General. General Daniel Count O'Connell, Knight of the Grand Cross and Order of the Holy Ghost, Colonel of the Royal Regiment French Infantry in the British service." The bearer of this precious morceau declares he is from Ballingarry.

Through the zeal and vigilance of that very useful member of our City Police, Serjeant Reidy, a notorious gang of roof-breakers and pigeon stealers, have been discovered, and some of them secured for trial.

On Saturday night last, the house of a poor industrious man, of the name of John Costelloe, at Ballyhahill, near Loughill, was entered into and £2 10 0 and one pound of tobacco taken thereout.

An inquest was held on Tuesday, before John D'Arcy, Esq. Clifden Castle, on the body of a discharged Policeman, of the name of Hogg. After several witnesses were examined, the Jury found, that "the deceased, Charles Hogg, came by his death in consequence of a shot fired by himself, while in a state of mental derangement."
