On Sunday morning, at his seat, Hurlston, county Clare, William Bentley, Esq. aged 70. This estimable Gentleman was a Magistrate for a period of more than forty years; and in the memorable year 1798, was Lieutenant of the Kilkishin Cavalry, and rendered efficient services to his county in those capacities. No man was more esteemed among the people, as well as the gentry of this district, where his usefulness as a resident Landlord and independent Magistrate particularly endeared him to his tenantry. His charity was unbounded yet unostentatious, and his acts of benevolence embraced all classes and sects of the community. The site for a Church and Church-Yard on his own demesne was his free gift to the parish of Broadford. His remains were interred yesterday morning in the family vault at Kilsiley.
