At Wexford Assizes nine countrymen pleaded guilty to a prosecution instituted by the Crown, for a conspiracy to obstruct by threats and force, Robert Macartney, Esq. Tythe Commissioner, while discharging his duty in the parish of Killesk, Rev. A. Stephenson, Rector. In the case of lessee Rev. S. Jeffares v. the Earl of Arran, to recover an acre and half of glebe land at Kilpatrick, diocese of Ferns, there was a verdict for defendant. Messrs. Kent, Ryan, father and son, and Irwin, were indicted, under a statute of the tenth of Charles I, for having illegal (Scotch) weirs. After a lengthened trial the Jury returned a verdict of conviction, one that has the effect of establishing the illegality of these celebrated weirs. There was another indictment against Mr. Pierse Cox, but he submitted. All the parties were then allowed to stand out upon their own recognizances.

Tuesday, the Waterford Grand Juries were sworn—Alderman M'Cheane foreman of the City, and Robt. Power, Esq. of the County. None for trial in the City; 48 in the County, including 23 for murder.

The Lord Lieutenant has offered £100 reward for the armed party that fired at and wounded two labourers near Portarlinton in the noon-day; also like reward for the midnight incendiaries who destroyed the house of James Dowde, farmer, near Kilcock, county Kildare.

Chief Constable Alexander Grant, at Newcastle, is under orders to leave this County for the county Cork. In the short period of his service in this district this active officer has now the praise and respect of the constituted authorities.

The Earl of Longford has resigned his situation in the Ballast Office, Dublin.

Wednesday last, a boy about 12 years of age was found drowned in a bog-hole, at Ahane, in the Liberties of this City. His name was John Magrath, and he had gone from Ballyclogh to the bog on Monday previous for turf, and is supposed to have fallen in accidentally and perished. The Mayor held an inquest on the body. Verdict accidental death.

An inquest was held at Ballyvodick, Cove of Cork, upon the body of Geary—shot in the affray with the coast guard, when a verdict of justifiable homicide was returned.

The investigation into the late Ballyhea affair is going on since Monday last at Listowel. Up to yesterday, but five witnesses have been examined, notwithstanding that Lord Kenmare, Major Miller, and the Barrister go into Court every day at ten o'clock, and do not leave until seven in the evening.

Murtagh, the man who murdered his wife in Eyrecourt by cutting off her head with a hatchet, has still escaped the vigilance of the police; he was seen near Ahascragh a few days ago.
