In Cork, at the advanced age of 84, Patrick Waters, Esq. Mr. Waters, who had been for many years the head of one of the most extensive establishments in Ireland, was lineally descended from Alderman John Walters (so the name was originally written), a zealous adherent of the House of York, and executed in consequence at Tyburn, in 1499, when Mayor of Cork, with Perkin Warbeck, whose pretensions to the Crown of England he had espoused in opposition to Henry VII.
