Yesterday morning a lad about 14 or 15 years of age,
named John Ryan, driving a horse and car laden with corn,
from Cappamore for market in this City, overcome by
fatigue, ascended the load, and lay on the top of the bags
for rest. Overcome with sleep he fell down upon the shafts,
and the wheel of the car with its heavy weight passed over
his head, inflicting a most extensive fracture, of which he
died on the road side in a few minutes.

A carman named Molony, driving home from market on
Saturday evening, was thrown from the vehicle at Rich-hill,
near Castle-Connell, and killed. The house was galloping
at a furious rate when the accident occurred.

John Morgan, mariner, of the Rose of Harrington, Steele
master, at the Lower Quays, fell from on board the Lord
Althorpe merchant vessel on Monday evening and was
drowned. He was apparently the worse of some drink he
had taken, and about to come ashore when he fell—his head
struck against the quay while falling into the water, and he
never rose afterwards. The body was recovered in a few
minutes, but vitality had ceased. The Mayor held an inquest,
verdict—accidental death.

The following important clause in the Insolvent Debtors'
Act is not generally known; by 2 Geo. 4, sec. 28—"When
order of discharge is granted, Court may also order a judg-
ment to be entered against prisoner in some of the superior
Courts of Dublin in name of Assignee for amount of debts
of such prisoner, and where it appears to the satisfaction of
the Court, that prisoner is of ability to pay debts, or part
thereof, or if dead, having affidavits for the purpose, Court
may permit execution to be taken out on such judgment, no
scire facias necessary to reverse such judgment, but execution
shall at all times issue thereon."
