**AWFUL DISCOVERY AND SUDDEN DEATH.**—Yesterday, about 12 o'clock, as Mr. George Watson was superintending some labourers he had employed in Nelson-street, off Clare-street, he directed a man, named Madigan, to descend thro' the roof of the adjoining house, occupied by Mr. Arthur L. Garton, and which had been exposed in order to repair some breaches. The man did so, and seeing Mr. Garton's bed-room door open and that gentleman in bed, Madigan expressed his hopes that Mr. Garton was not disturbed by their work, but not receiving an answer after repeating the observation, he became alarmed and informed his employer that he feared Mr. Garton was ill. Mr. Watson immediately called on Surgeon Franklin, who was in the neighbourhood, attending to the externs at the City Infirmary. Surgeon Franklin instantly repaired to the room of Mr. Garton, and to his astonishment, upon removing the bed-clothes, found Mr. Garton not only dead but in a very advanced state of decomposition, so much so, as to render the spectacle most repulsive. Intelligence being forwarded to the Mayor, his Worship promptly held an inquest on the body, when it appeared in evidence that the deceased led a very secluded life, and had neither companion or servant. He was in the habit of frequently leaving home for days and even weeks—therefore the circumstance of his house being closed for the week did not create surprise or suspicion. A female attendant, the only person who had an occasional access to his apartments, stated, she saw him last on Monday, and had prepared his dinner, but on her knocking at his hall-door on Tuesday morning, it was not opened, however, as he used frequently to go to the country, she supposed he was out of town, and did not think more of it.—The Jury found that the deceased died by the visitation of Almighty God, and that his death took place some days since.—Mr. Garton was an eminent Musician, and was employed by the Gentry of this and the adjoining counties, and was highly respected.
