With unfeigned sorrow, we have to record the death of our venerable and most respected fellow citizen Joseph Massy Harvey, Esq. This melancholy event took place suddenly, on Saturday last, at the house of his relative John Todhunter, Esq. Dublin, where he had been on a visit for some weeks. The many virtues which adorned his career during a life of 70 years, are too familiar to the public of Limerick to require a lengthened obituary, at a moment when those who are best acquainted with his extensive benevolence, and incessant exertions in the welfare and advancement of our City, are too deeply participating in his loss. We shall only say, that as long as the highest moral integrity and Christian philanthropy, are deemed the best attributes of our nature, his memory will be revered by all who had the happiness of knowing him. His remains are expected to arrive in this City to-morrow morning for interment.

The City High Sheriffs have received an order from Dublin Castle to transmit the following convicts, some time in the City Gaol, to the hulk Surprise at Cove, preparatory to transportation to New South Wales:—John Lyons, John Brady, Michael Cahill, Edward Cussen, Catherine Shanny or Danaher, Johanna Sweeny, Bridget Hayes, Johanna Galvin, Catherine Ryan, Ellen Galvin, Lucy Minahan, Elizabeth Greany, Mary Hickey, Ann Frawley, Honora Sheedy, Bridget Stapleton, Honora Peaton, and Mary Malone. The female convicts were sent forward this morning under an escort of the 18th Regiment.

The General Quarter Sessions were opened pro forma at a late hour yesterday evening before Mr. Hussey Griffith, Acting Assistant Barrister, after which the Court adjourned to ten o'clock this morning for business.

Sunday evening, in the town of Kilmallock, a barbarous murder was perpetrated. An industrious man of the name of Maurice Finn, was on his way home from the town to Ballingady, when he was accosted by a noted character of the name of Condon, who, without any provocation, hit Finn a blow of a stone on the right side of the head, which caused instant death; medical aid was procured on the spot, but the spark of life was extinct—great credit is due to Dr. Mortished for his prompt attention on this occasion. The murderer had been arrested by a few towns-people, but at the approach of Constable Hayes a ruffianly mob let the prisoner at liberty. The Constable and one of his assistants, pursued him near a mile, and would have overtaken him were it not for a countryman who put him on horseback and rode away, consequently escaping the pursuit of the Police. We trust the arm of the law will yet overtake the murderer.

The Lord Lieutenant has offered £100 reward for the murderers of James Dunn, near Ballinahown, Westmeath, and also £100 for the murderers of James Gorman, near Armagh, both crimes perpetrated the week before last.

A bank note for £50 was stolen from the safe of the Collector of Customs, Galway, last week, while the door lay open for a few minutes.
